PTE. JOHN DAY WOUNDED.

An old Grenadier, Pte. John Day was wounded on April 24th in the Arras Battle. The son of Mrs. Day, of Sundon, he was not called up at mobilisation as he was on Government work connected with hay and straw tying, but in due course he was called to the Colours, being drafted out to France last July. He is now at a hospital in Newport, Mon., Wales.

PTE. H. W. SANDERS WOUNDED.

Enlisting in November last year in the Manchester Regiment, Pte. Herbert Ward Sanders was wounded on April 2nd. He is only 19 years old, and went to France in February, then having had barely three months' training. He is now in hospital at Bethnal Green, London.

L.-CPL. MUCKLESTON GASSED.

"Gassed accidentally" at a gassing school was the fate of L.-Cpl. Muckleston, of Sundon, who enlisted in the Suffolk Regiment in August, 1915. He has seen twelve months' service in France, was gassed at the end of January and has been in hospital ever since, having just rejoined his regiment.
