

FUNERAL OF MR. S. E. CANNON.—The funeral took place on Saturday afternoon at the Luton Church Cemetery of Mr. Sydney Ewart Cannon, aged 23 years, son of Mr. and Mrs. T. Cannon, of 6, Crawley Green-road. The service was conducted by the Rev. W. C. M. Winter, curate of the Parish Church. Deceased was an old Modern School boy, and subsequently was with Messrs. Paul Walser and Co., until he joined the Royal Flying Corps in February, 1916. He was discharged in December, 1917, owing to tubercular trouble.
